MESSAGE

When we reflect on our lives, we are always operating from a place of either fear or

love – fear of what others think of us, fear of losing our job, fear of losing our relationship, or fear of losing control.

Jonathan Haidt refers to today's youth as "The Anxious Generation." His research reveals that something shifted dramatically for young people born after 1995. Around the early 2010s, their mental health deteriorated, with anxiety and depression rates soaring. Alarmingly, self-harm among younger teen girls rose by 150%, and suicide rates increased

Haidt outlines over a dozen ways this "great rewiring of childhood" has impacted young people's social and neurological development, citing issues like sleep deprivation, attention fragmentation, addiction, loneliness, social contagion, and the pressures of comparison and perfectionism.

Concerned by these trends, I conducted a survey among the youth in my church.

Upon further enquiry, I found that Gen Z's source of anxiety is similar to that of other generations: the overwhelming desire to feel "good enough."

What do you think is the source of these anxiety? What do you think is the source of these anxiety? social media,satan,and i think to a certain degree we ourselves inflict anxiety and pressure because we want to be "good enough"

The truth is, without Jesus, we will never truly feel good enough. We may chase job security, relational security, or financial stability, but these pursuits alone cannot fill the void.

Archie Coates aptly put it: "The most secure people in the world are not the most beautiful, talented, or successful. They are not the ones with the most promising prospects, the most comfortable lifestyle, or the most friends. The most secure people are those who know they are deeply loved."

Romans 8:38 reminds us of this profound truth: "There is nothing in this whole world that could ever separate you from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus."

I witnessed this kind of transformative love firsthand during an Alpha Weekend Away in Port Dickson. My friend Z was going through personal struggles—he felt anxious, and uncertain about his career, and was facing relationship challenges. He decided to join us for the Alpha Weekend Away. During one of the prayer sessions, he unexpectedly left the hall. Concerned, I followed him and found him sitting outside, cigarette in hand, with tears streaming down his face. When I asked what was wrong, he sobbed, 'I've never felt this way before... I feel loved.' At that moment, the love of Christ poured into him, breaking through his defences and meeting him right where he was.

Pope John Paul II once said, "Evangelisation must touch people's minds and hearts, stir their consciences, and engage all their energies." This is precisely what Alpha aims to do. Nicky Gumbel emphasises "Our message in Alpha does not simply require intellectual assent to a series of propositions; rather, it calls people into a love relationship with Jesus Christ"

Finding Purpose in the WORKPLACE



Work Inspired:by Purpose Conference 2024

The Work Inspired:by Purpose (WIP) Conference 2024 was held on August 23-24 at the Alpha Hub, Lot 10 Rooftop, Bukit Bintang, Kuala Lumpur.

The conference focused on how faith can help Christian professionals discover purpose and success in the modern workplace through engaging forums, interactive sessions, and thought-provoking talks. Attendees explored these themes:

- **Seeking My Purpose**: Refining one's understanding of their unique professional role.
- **Seeking God's Purpose**: Aligning personal ambitions with God's divine plan for one's career.
- Seeking to Live Out Purpose: Translating faith into practical actions that transform the workplace.

More than 700 delegates from 112 organisations attended the two-day event. Ranging from entrepreneurs, working professionals, influencers, and marketplace leaders.

Key speakers include YB Yeo Bee Yin, Member of Parliament; Pr. Dr. Philip Lyn, Medical Doctor and Senior Pastor of Skyline SIB; Dato' Kathleen Chew, Chair of Alpha Malaysia; Loi Tuan Ee, Founder and CEO of Farm Fresh; and Rev. Dr. Miles Toulmin, Global CEO of Alpha International and Vicar of Holy Trinity Bukit Bintang, among many others.











The WIP Conference aimed to equip attendees with practical tools and inspiration to integrate their faith with their professional lives. Participants hoped to return to their workplaces with a revitalised sense of purpose and potentially transformed career trajectories.

The WIP Series is a three-part course exploring common workplace challenges. It discusses insights and perspectives on struggles, success and standing out. The series aims to create a safe space for conversations about the Christian faith and its role in inspiring purposeful work. It also serves as a precursor to future Alpha courses.

Each episode is designed for a lunch break and features real-life testimonies from Ryan Ng (cofounder of DriveFunnels, now with Alpha Malaysia), Bryan Chin (founder of SneakerLAH) and Suzanne Ling (co-founder of PichaEats). Additionally, each episode offers lessons from thought leaders—Alvin Ung (Author), Pr Dr Philip Lyn (Medical Doctor and Senior Pastor of Skyline SIB) and Sheela Ratnam (Chief of Staff, CircularCommerce).

The first episode of the WIP Series was premiered on August 23, 2024, at the Work Inspired:by Purpose Conference.

FINDING HOPE:

My Journey from Despair to Redemption

"These changes were not of my doing but through the grace of God.

I'm forever grateful for the new life I've been given."

Shanice (third from left in photo), an Alpha guest, said she grew up as an only child with a single parent and faced constant parental conflict, which led to their eventual divorce when she was very young. She was bullied and insecure about her appearance, causing her development of anger issues and a lack of self-love.

Shanice said she fell in with the wrong crowd, turned to smoking, and became addicted. She experienced nightmares and had suicidal thoughts, which was a wake-up call for her to search for answers.

Raised in a religious environment, Shanice tried prayers and rituals but to no avail, as she continued to struggle. She explored other beliefs, including visiting temples, consulting fortune tellers, and delving into horoscopes, but still found no relief.

Disillusioned with traditional faiths, Shanice gave up on concepts of heaven, hell, and divine existence and continued to live a destructive lifestyle

Everything changed when a client at work introduced her to Jesus during Malaysia's lockdown in mid-2021. Despite initial scepticism, personal revelations from the client about Shanice's past, known only to her, sparked a profound shift.

Three months later, through a fated phone call, Shanice felt an inexplicable warmth during the conversation and embraced Jesus as her Savior. Since then, Shanice's life has transformed dramatically. She began experiencing joy, clarity, and self-love. Her nightmares have ceased, and she succeeded in quitting

Shanice said she believes these changes are a miracle and are not of her own doing. She is grateful for the new life she has been given.

Alpha LEADS TO FAITH in Jesus

"Don't follow your dreams; follow Jesus!"

Before becoming a Christian, Kenny Cheong explored different beliefs as he struggled to find a clear direction in life. His sister introduced him to the Alpha course at First Baptist Church (FBC) in Kuching, which opened his eyes to the Christian faith.

Cheong was drawn to Christianity because of the Bible's power to bring peace and the concept of grace. He explained how he learned that grace is a gift, freely given by God, and that mercy is when God protects us from the consequences we deserve. Blessings are the overflow of both grace and mercy.

He learned that contrary to other religions, Christianity is about what Jesus did for us by sacrificing Himself for our sins. By believing in Him, we are freely saved as God's children and do good works because of His love and forgiveness.

Cheong continues to learn about Jesus and encourages others to do the same through Bible studies and resources like FBC's online Bible Journey.

KUAYUE

KUAYUE was created to bridge generational gaps among Chinese churches. This event brought together Christians from different denominations, ages, and leadership roles to foster empathy, connection, and unity through a series of interactive sessions.

The event brought together 86 participants from 13 churches which aimed to bridge generational gaps, and seek empathy and unity. Through panel sessions, games, breakout room discussion and fellowship, participants discussed how church members, young and old, can contribute to the community of God.

"Through KUAYUE, I learned the importance of being ONE in church, making an effort to work with and reach out to other generations beyond my group," said a church leader from Kepong CMC.

"I was surprised to see the turnout," said Pastor Yew, the main speaker at KUAYUE. "It's offen that we see low interest in events like these. I'm thankful for this platform created by Alpha to raise awareness of generational issues within the Chinese church."

The Logos Presbyterian Church Gospel Sharing Session was held on March 23, 2024, bringing together 11 Logos Presbyterian Churches and more than 70 participants at the Logos Presbyterian Church in Old Klang Road. The event included icebreaker activities, a sharing session by Elder Board Chairman Pastor Jiang Zhihai, gospel testimonies from various churches, and a workshop.

The main objective was to encourage and mobilise the Logos Presbyterian Churches for evangelism. Alpha Malaysia conducted a workshop called Alpha Connect to promote Alpha's Best Practices. At this workshop, we addressed questions such as why prayer before meals is not encouraged in the early weeks of Alpha, why Alpha is evangelistic but not apologetic, and why Alpha is run over 11 sessions. This prompted significant reflection among the Logos Presbyterian Churches that host Alpha courses, helping them break free from misconceptions and gain a true understanding of Alpha.



Experiencing Alpha Sandakan

As part of our Seek Cities initiative, Alpha Malaysia partnered with three churches in Sandakan (St. Michael All Angels Church, Christian Fellowship Sandakan, and House of Blessing Sandakan) to organise Experiencing Alpha Sandakan. It was an impactful event where 130 participants from 14 churches were envisioned and trained to run Alpha in Bahasa Malaysia in both church and youth contexts.

The event demonstrated how Alpha can foster stronger connections among individuals. Previously shy participants have become more outgoing and engaged in conversations. In traditional church settings, congregants often come and go without much interaction, especially with those they don't know. Alpha, however, provides a unique opportunity for individuals from diverse denominational backgrounds to communicate effectively.

SARAWAK YOUTH EVANGELISM

Memorandum of Understanding Signing between Alpha Malaysia and BEM Sarawak

Alpha Malaysia and Borneo Evangelical Mission (BEM) Sarawak signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on October 17, 2023, to collaborate in the areas of youth evangelism, leadership, and family life. Paul Kong, National Director of Alpha Malaysia, and Reverend Bina Agong, President of BEM Sarawak, signed the agreement.

The partnership has led to several initiatives. One is a Sarawak-wide research project, "Catalysing Change: Understanding the Vision of Sarawak Youth for Leadership and Community." The survey seeks to provide Sarawakian churches with insights into youth identity, leadership, and community.

In addition, the Alpha Youth and Campus team has trained more than 250 youth pastors and leaders from 26 BEM churches in Miri, Sibu, Kuching, and Bintulu, focusing on evangelism through Alpha. The Executive Leadership of BEM attended the Alpha Regional Gathering together with leaders from all over Asia—exploring the future of youth, leadership and evangelism. Representatives from Pelayanan Pemuda Pemudi (PPP) BEM Sarawak joined the Circle and Spaces cohort, collaborating on reimagining and planning the future of youth ministry.

FROM SKEPTIC TO FACILITATOR:

Alpha Transforms Faith

"The simple format and open discussions fostered a comfortable space for sharing and asking questions."

Simon Siah, an Alpha host at Sacred Heart Church in Kota Sentosa, said he was initially sceptical about the program when he first encountered it during his studies in England in 2007.

Siah said he found the video-based approach of Alpha different from the traditional cell group discussions he was used to. However, when he volunteered as a facilitator during the recent MCO, he found the content familiar but not as challenging to consume.

In 2022, Siah and his wife, Caroline, co-facilitated an Alpha course in Chinese. Despite language barriers and a significant age gap between them and their participants, who were mostly non-Christians in their 50s. Siah said he was concerned about leading meaningful discussions considering the differences in their age.

However, Siah said God had a plan. The group had perfect attendance each week, and the simple format and open discussions created a comfortable space for sharing and asking questions.

Siah said the Holy Spirit Weekend was a highlight. He said he was nervous about leading prayers, but he trusted God's guidance. Witnessing the work of the Holy Spirit was a powerful experience for both him and the group.

Siah said he and his wife experienced personal spiritual growth through their involvement in Alpha. They volunteered again in 2023 and saw more evidence of God's work.

As a result of their involvement in Alpha, three guests are now in Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) classes, and a family of four is choosing Catholicism. Siah said Alpha has become a transformative part of his life and is more than just a course; it is a community that fosters connection and a deeper understanding of God.

Richard Janggui emphasised the importance of churches supporting families and marriages. He highlighted that faith should be central to everything, including our relationships and family life. Children learn by observing their parents, so to raise a generation grounded in faith, we need to demonstrate our reliance on God within our marriages.

David and Fiona, a couple who attended the course, found it incredibly beneficial. Married for over two years with a six-month-old son, they previously struggled to find quality time together due to work and childcare. Fiona even worked in a different city for a while, creating further distance. This lack of quality time took a toll on their connection.

The course helped them understand the importance of intentional effort in their marriage. Fiona initially thought "quality time" meant expensive dates or getaways. However, they learned that it's simply about spending time together, listening actively, offering encouragement, and praying as a couple.

One positive change Fiona noticed is appreciating her husband's acts of service. She used to decline rides to work or the airport, thinking she was sparing him the trouble. Through the course, she realised these acts were David's way of showing love and cherishing their limited time together. Now, she happily accepts his rides, even the early morning ones! These shared drives have become a cherished way for them to invest in their relationship.




